

# Calvary in Action: LOCALLY Family Ministry

Calvary Kids and Calvary Youth exist to provide a safe place for kids to build relationships with one another and be taught Gospelcentered teaching. We do this by making our time with the kids engaging and fun, but also taking the time to have deeper discussions about being a disciple of Jesus.

As part of Calvary Kids and Calvary Youth, we desire to partner with families in ministry. We believe that parents are the primary spiritual leaders of their children and ought to be the ones who train them in the ways of the Lord. However, that can sound daunting to a lot of people who feel overwhelmed and don't know where to start. Our goal is to come alongside parents and give them the resources they need to disciple their children well.

We want to encourage parents to grow in their relationships with the Lord so they can pass down a rich and thriving faith to their children. Deuteronomy 11:18–19 says, "Fix these words of mine in your hearts and minds; tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. Teach them to your children, talking about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up."



Our desire is to see parents that walk with the Lord so closely that talking about Him day in and day out is natural and commonplace. We have compiled many resources to encourage and build up parents. These resources can be found at calvarystp.org/parents.

We plan to provide parenting events, book studies and focus groups throughout the year. We also love to get families together so they can build relationships and encourage one another. Nine years ago, we read that Campbell Park Elementary had received an "F" grading score and they were looking for community partners to help them improve. After meeting with the principal to hear how we can come alongside them, we learned that providing "Lunch Pals" for the students was one of their greatest needs. Lunch Pals develop friendships and are a positive role model by meeting with a child once a week during the child's lunch time.

Over the past several years, our Lunch Pals Outreach has expanded to include other schools in our community. Is there a school close to your home or work where you can give one hour a week to make a lasting impact on our next generation by becoming a Lunch Pal? Our children need the support of caring adults more than ever! One of our Lunch Pals, Tiffany, says: "These students just need someone who will listen to and encourage them... You just need to show up and be consistent. I have

Another part of Love Our Schools is to provide school uniforms, encourage staff through various ways, and supply Christmas gifts to families in need.

### **Assisted Living Facility**

### Calvary Chapel, St. Petersburg: Bringing the Church to the Assisted Living Facility

At Calvary Chapel, St. Petersburg, we are blessed to have a vibrant and dedicated team of volunteers who serve our local community in various ways, one of which is through a weekly ministry at a nearby Assisted Living Facility (ALF). Every Sunday, from 10:00 to 10:30 a.m., a dedicated team brings worship, teaching, and fellowship to residents who are unable to attend church due to physical limitations. The time is brief, but it is meaningful and it reflects Jesus' greatest commandments from Mark 12:30-31: to "love God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself."

Many ALF residents feel isolated, but their desire to worship the Lord remains strong. When they requested that the Word of God be brought to them, our church responded eagerly. Now, each week, a group from Calvary Chapel prepares and delivers a Bible teaching, offering spiritual encouragement and hope.

Others on our team offer hospitality, prayer, and companionship, ensuring the residents feel loved and supported. Their efforts provide meaningful connection and renewal for the residents, which helps to lift their spirits and fosters a sense of community.



### **Women of Heart**

The Women of Heart ministry was birthed out of a great need for a member of Calvary Chapel in 2002. At that time, various women rallied around this member by organizing meal plans, cleaning schedules, and even visiting schedules.

Over the years the group grew larger, and the handwritten schedules and calling system was replaced with digital schedules and an email system, allowing it to become more efficient and what it is today. Women of Heart has 109 members who are notified of various needs. The most common need is providing meals to people who are recovering from surgery, bringing home new babies, or losing close family members. We also occasionally send out requests for other needs.

The great thing about being a part of the Women of Heart team is that it is at your own discretion - if you can bring a meal or help with another need, that is wonderful! But if you can't meet the need, there is no pressure or obligation. It is a privilege to see how quickly the Lord moves the hearts of women. Meal plans are usually filled up within a few days and the miscellaneous requests are usually filled quite timely as well. We give glory to God for providing such faithful, generous women who are eager and ready to help others in times of need. This group certainly is a movement of the gospel of Jesus.



### From India to the World

### The "V's" Journey of Faith and Media Mission

At Calvary Chapel St. Petersburg, we believe in fulfilling the Great Commission, sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ with all nations. It is with great excitement that we introduce you to a missionary family who embodies this calling-Jose and Sarah "V," along with their three children, Zohara, Zuwena, and Jaden. The V family have answered God's call to minister to the people of India and the global Indian diaspora through an innovative and powerful mode-visual media. Their story is one of faith, perseverance, and grace in the face of tremendous hardship, and now, Calvary Chapel St. Petersburg is privileged to partner with them in this important mission.

### A Journey of Faith in India

Jose and Sarah both come from India, a nation with a rich history but one that is also deeply entrenched in a multitude of spiritual beliefs. Jose was raised in a traditional Indian home but came to know the Lord in his early twenties. After encountering the transformative power of the Gospel, Jose felt a burning desire to share the message of Christ with his fellow countrymen. Sarah, similarly developed a heart for her own people after her conversion to Christianity. Together, they began ministering in India, enduring hardships and trials that tested their faith but also saw God's power working through their efforts.

In 2016, one of the most remarkable moments of their ministry occurred in Mumbai. Jose was called to pray for a 20-year-old Hindu man named Devendra, who suffered from stage IV leukemia. Hopeless and ready to give up on life, Devendra found new hope in Christ after Jose shared the Gospel with him. Miraculously, Devendra was healed, both spiritually and physically. Today, Devendra is a vibrant believer who shares his testimony in the villages and slums

of India, proving that God is still working miracles in even the most desperate situations.

Despite seeing many come to faith in Christ, the V family faced relentless opposition. Anti-Christian sentiment grew, and the couple endured threats, attacks, and constant pressure to stop their ministry. Yet, they continued to witness the Lord's hand guiding them through these trials, growing a thriving church in Navi Mumbai and ministering to countless souls.



#### The Call to Visual Media

As their ministry grew, Jose and Sarah recognized the unique challenges of sharing the Gospel in India. India is home to more than 1.4 billion people, with hundreds of languages and a rich cultural diversity. Yet the Gospel has struggled to penetrate many communities due to language barriers, spiritual traditions, and the geographical vastness of the nation.

In response, the V family began exploring ways to reach more people beyond the traditional church setting. They found an answer in visual media—television and internet videos. These platforms have allowed them to share Christ with millions across India and beyond. Through their ministry called "Simply Bible," Jose and Sarah teach the Word of God verse by verse, bringing the truth of

Scripture to people in their native languages, including Hindi and English.

During the height of the COVID-19 pandemic, when in-person church services were restricted, the Lord opened an incredible door for their ministry. They were invited to preach the Gospel on a Christian television channel, which reaches millions of viewers across India. Since then, they have expanded their broadcasts to multiple languages, and their episodes are now viewed by millions, spreading the message of hope and salvation to people who may have never stepped foot inside a church.

### From India to St. Petersburg

The V family's journey to the United States came at a time when the dangers where they were became too great to ignore. After enduring multiple threats, including a kidnapping attempt, and facing severe financial difficulties, they felt the Lord calling them to move to a place of safety where they could continue their ministry. Through the guidance and support of their missions organization, Intensive Care Ministries, the V family arrived in the United States in May 2023, carrying with them nothing but their faith and the mission God had placed on their hearts.

Since arriving in Florida, God has connected them with our church here at Calvary Chapel St. Petersburg. Under the leadership of the CCSP missions director, Calvary has partnered with the V family to help them continue their ministry to India from a safe base in the U.S. With the help of our church family and the local community, they have been able to record and broadcast new episodes for their television ministry, reaching millions of viewers in India and others throughout the world.

As Jose explains, "We never imagined we would end up in St. Petersburg, but God had it all planned. Calvary Chapel has become our home, and we are excited to see how the Lord is using this partnership to reach even more people with the Gospel."

### Partnering with the V Family

Jose and Sarah V's journey from the streets of Mumbai to the shores of St. Petersburg is a testimony to God's faithfulness and the power of the gospel. Their story reminds us that even in the face of persecution and trials, God's grace is sufficient, and His work will continue. But this mission is not one they can carry alone. They need the prayers and support of their church family.

As a church, we have the opportunity to partner with the Vs in a meaningful way—to help

spread the Gospel to one of the largest and most spiritually needy people group in the world. Whether through prayer, financial support, or personal involvement, you can play a part in bringing the light of Christ to millions of people.

# Evangelism and Discipleship in a Closed Country

Since moving to Southeast Asia in 2012, Julie has had the privilege of serving in a "closed" country where traditional missionary work is not allowed. Before coming here, her time at Calvary Chapel St. Petersburg prepared her for this journey through classes, mission trips, and a growing understanding of God's heart for the nations. Now, she serves as a teacher in a government-run university in a country that is closed to missionary work. Her occupation there gives her the opportunity to build relationships, meet practical needs, and share the love of Christ with future generations. In that culture, building relationships

takes time, but after over 10 years, she is beginning to see the fruits of this labor. One example is Luke, a student she met early on who was one of the few believers in her faculty. As she and her team walked alongside him, Luke grew in his faith and even began sharing the Gospel with his classmates. encounter in this country.

New Christians there often face persecution, sometimes being forced to leave their villages if they refuse to renounce their faith in Jesus. The country also struggles with poor education and an underdeveloped healthcare system.

Because of its ethnic diversity, unity among believers is difficult, but we trust in God to overcome these obstacles.

The work here requires patience, perseverance, and a deep reliance on the Holy Spirit. We invite you to partner with Julie through prayer and to consider financially supporting this work.

# Investing in Bible Translation in Southeast Asia

At Calvary Chapel, St. Petersburg (CCSP), we are deeply committed to the life-changing power of God's Word. One of the ways we live out this commitment is by supporting Bible translation efforts in Southeast Asia, specifically in partnering with Wycliffe missionaries who dedicate their lives to making Scripture accessible to unreached communities. While some, like Ethan and Camille Riechenbach. are directly involved in the translation work itself, others such as Ken and Sheila Nelson, and Sean and Rebekah C (the C family)

provide essential support through roles in medical care, teaching, facility management, and editorial leadership. This mission is a team effort requiring diverse skills and dedication.

Ethan and Camille's journey with Bible translation began by immersing themselves in the Agob culture in Papua New Guinea, learning the language firsthand to accurately translate the Bible into the tribe's native tongue. Bible translation is a laborintensive process that can span decades, often requiring multiple

generations of missionaries. Ethan serves as the lead translator, while Camille, a medical doctor, provides healthcare to the local community. Their work is sustained by a vast network of support from both local and global partners, ensuring that no aspect of the mission falls solely on one person. Beyond the translation work, others like Ken and Sheila Nelson ensure the entire operation runs smoothly. They manage logistics,

oversee the mission base, and care for the daily needs of both the missionaries and the local community. The C family plays a pivotal role by leading a Bible translation editing team based in Southeast Asia, working to translate the Scriptures into another Southeast Asian language. From managing administrative duties to educating children, every member contributes to the mission's success.









As we continue to support these missionaries, we ask you to join us in prayer. Please pray for the Agob tribe, for favor with local leaders, and for unity among the translation teams. Pray for the Reichenbachs, Nelsons, and the C family, asking God to provide them strength, peace, and wisdom as

they continue their vital work of bringing the Gospel to those who have never heard it.

Together, we trust that God will use these translations to touch lives and transform generations for His Kingdom.


